



SCENARIOS

Scenario 1

SCENARIO:	Kim went to a party last night and got very drunk. When Kim wakes up they think they might have had unsafe sex.
QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION:	What might Kim be worried about? What would you advise Kim to do?
LEARNING POINTS:	Anyone who may have had unprotected sex should go to a doctor or sexual health clinic as soon as possible as some STIs and pregnancy can be avoided after sexual contact. Anyone who is worried that they have been sexually assaulted they could contact: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ A rape crisis centre ■ A trusted teacher, youth or health worker ■ The police.

Scenario 2

SCENARIO:	Charlie and Tatum have been together for a few months and like each other a lot. Tatum is keen to start having sex but Charlie isn't sure they are ready.
QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION:	How might Tatum tell Charlie that they want to start having sex? Is it OK to ask for sex to be part of a relationship? Is it OK to say no to sex? What might Charlie say back to Tatum? Do young people sometimes put pressure on partners for sex? What could partners say when they are being pressured to have sex?
LEARNING POINTS:	Everyone has the right to make decisions about sex. No-one has the right to demand sex. People make lots of complex decisions about when and why they have sex. It is important to make realistic and informed decisions.

Scenario 3

SCENARIO:	Leigh and Jessie are about to have sex together for the first time. Jessie wants to use condoms but Leigh says that condoms don't feel natural and that they don't 'have anything' anyway.
QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION:	What are the risks for Jessie and Leigh? What other reasons have you heard for people not wanting to use a condom? What could Jessie say to Leigh to make sure they used a condom?
LEARNING POINTS:	People may not know that they have an STI, or they might not be honest about it when they do know. Everyone has a right to protect themselves and a responsibility to protect sexual partners. The start of a sexual relationship is a great time to talk about condoms or other barriers and contraception.

Scenario 4

SCENARIO:	15 year old Jules has been flirting online with Ashley for a few weeks. Ashley sent Jules a sexy picture and asks Jules to send one back.
QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION:	What might Jules be worried about? What does the law say about these images? What do young people say about these images? What are some ways Jules can protect themselves?
LEARNING POINTS:	Young people have a right to privacy and consent in the online space. Sharing sexy pictures can have social or legal consequences.
